We chose transmitter sites so that there would be a minimum of driving, a friendly pub, and places which gave some cover, as there was little to be found at this time of year. I had surveyed the Copford area along Hall Lane a couple of weeks before, and having already used Pits Wood a few years ago, decided that the area adjacent to the sewage works by the river would be a good spot, as it was boggy in places and still retained cover from fallen trees and dead brambles.
